Subject : Philippine Holidays for the Year 2022 - Proclamation No. 1236

This is to inform you of **Proclamation No. 1236** dated 29 October 2021, declaring the following regular holidays and special non-working days for the year 2022 to be observed throughout the country.

A. Regular Holidays

April 14 - Maundy Thursday
April 15 - Good Friday

August 29 - National Heroes Day

November 30 - Bonifacio Day December 30 - Rizal Day

B. Special Non-Working Holidays

February 01 - Chinese New Year

February 25 - EDSA People Power Revolution Anniversary

November 01 - All Saints' Day

December 08 - Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary

Still to be announced are the dates when the national holidays for the observance of Eidul Fitr and Eidul Adha shall fall.

We will advise you in our succeeding memos on how deliveries and payments for settlement on the said dates shall be rescheduled. Attached for your reference is a copy of Proclamation No. 1236 issued by Malacañang.

PROCLAMATION NO. 1236

DECLARING THE REGULAR HOLIDAYS AND SPECIAL (WORKING/NON-WORKING) DAYS FOR THE YEAR 2022

WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 9492 dated 24 July 2007 amended Section 26, Chapter 7, Book I of Executive Order (EO) No. 292, also known as the Administrative Code of 1987, by declaring certain days (specific or movable) as special or regular holidays;

WHEREAS, RA No. 9849 dated 11 December 2009 provides that the Eidul Adha shall be celebrated as a national holiday;

WHEREAS, on 01 February 2022, Chinese nationals all over the world will celebrate Spring Festival, popularly known as the Chinese New Year, which is one of the most revered and festive events celebrated not only in China but also in the Philippines, and such date may be declared as a special (non-working) day without detriment to public interest;

WHEREAS, on 25 February 2022, the country will commemorate the 36th Anniversary of the EDSA People Power Revolution, which restored democracy and ushered political, social, and economic reforms in the country;

WHEREAS, Black Saturday, which falls on 16 April 2022, has been traditionally declared a special (non-working) day throughout the country, the observance of Holy Week being one of the most cherished traditions of our predominantly Catholic people;

WHEREAS, RA No. 10966 dated 28 December 2017 provides that December 8 of every year shall be celebrated as a special non-working holiday in the entire country to commemorate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary; and

WHEREAS, for the country to recover from the adverse economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, there is a need to encourage economic productivity by, among others, minimizing work disruption and commemorating some special holidays as special (working) days instead;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RODRIGO ROA DUTERTE, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution as President of the Philippines, do hereby declare:

SECTION 1. The following regular holidays and special days for the year 2022 shall be observed in the country:

A. Regular Holidays

New Year's Day Araw ng Kagitingan - 1 January (Saturday) - 9 April (Saturday)

April 14 15 April May (Sunday) 1 June (Sunday) 12 August (Last Monday of 29 August) 30 November (Wednesday) 25 December (Sunday) December (Friday) 30

B. Special (Non-Working) Days

Maundy Thursday Good Friday

Independence Day

National Heroes Day

Labor Day

Bonifacio Day

Rizal Day

Christmas Day

C. Special (Working) Days

All Souls' Day - 2 November (Wednesday)
Christmas Eve - 24 December (Saturday)
Last Day of the Year - 31 December (Saturday)

SECTION 2. The proclamations declaring national holidays for the observance of Eidul Fitr and Eidul Adha shall hereafter be issued after the approximate dates of the Islamic holidays have been determined in accordance with the Islamic calendar (Hijra) or the lunar calendar, or upon Islamic astronomical calculations, whichever is possible or convenient. To this end, the National Commission on Muslim Filipinos shall recommend to the Office of the President the actual dates on which these holidays shall respectively fall.

SECTION 3. The Department of Labor and Employment shall promulgate the implementing guidelines for this Proclamation.

SECTION 4. This Proclamation shall take effect immediately.

SECTION 5. This Proclamation shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.
